



## If you are thinking of leaving a gift to **The Haven** in your will there are some things to consider...

Always nominate an executor to ensure the instructions in your will are carried out. This should always be someone you trust such as family or close friends.

Consider all the people you want to leave something to and then think about the things you will be leaving including savings, property and other possessions. It may help to make a list of family, friends and charities, along with a list of possessions before creating your will.

Think about what type of gift you want to leave to your chosen charities, such as The Haven. There are different types of gift you can leave. This includes a **pecuniary gift** - a specific amount of money – and a **residuary gift** which is a percentage or the remaining amount once all other gifts and expenses have been arranged.
